Crying of Newspapers,
Sale of Cigars, Etc., on Sunday.

Reverend W. W. Davis and George F. Clark came before the Board and presented to it petition, as follows, numerously signed:

"To The Police Commissioners

of Baltimore City.

Gentlemen:-

Representing the churches in the Northern part of Baltimore, we ask you to make a careful investigation of Sunday conditions in our part of this city, and as far as you can instruct your officers to quietly and tactfully enforce the Sunday law. As this is almost exclusively a residential section we are fully convinced that many places are open and much business is done on Sunday, for which there is no necessity.

We desire especially to call your attention to the crying out of Sunday newspapers both morning and afternoon, to the large number of stores of all kinds open on Sunday, to the sales of cigars, candy, etc., in drug stores, open ostensibly for sale of medicines, and to the open fruit stand on E. North avenue and other places. Having observed the growing harmful effects of those conditions in our community, we ask you to help us remedy them before they get beyond our control. We respectfully suggest that you treat that part of the city north of Union Station and between the York Road and the Falls as a unit and if this plan works here then apply it to the residential section of the city, as may seem wise to your Honorable body. Assuring you it will be our pleasure as well as the pleasure of the several congregations to give you every co-operation within our power, we are,


