

the cases to be tried. At six station-houses the lieutenant or round sergeants enters into the Magistrate's docket the name of the person accused, the charge, the name of the officer and witness and the magistrate fills in the rest at the hearing.

As to commitments. At four of the houses, the magistrates make out all commitments. At three, both magistrate and lieutenant or desk officer make out commitments, and at one, the desk officer makes them out.

I enclose herewith a table showing how these matters are conducted at each station house.

At their last meeting the Magistrates discussed this matter, and all agreed in recommending the Magistrates' docket be partly made out by the lieutenant or desk officer, by entering the name of the accused, the address of the accused, the officer making the arrest, the charge and the witnesses with their addresses, as far as known, the magistrate making all other entries.

The President of your Board has suggested that the Magistrates keep a record of warrants issued as the practice regarding such records vary. The magistrates have adopted the suggestion and all agreed to keep such record. It is suggested that a special record book be made up for this purpose and furnished to the magistrates.
