A report, as follows, was received from the Marshal and held for further consideration:

"Baltimore, Md., June 13th., 1912.

To The Honorable,
The Board of Police Commissioners.
Gentlemen:-

Relative to the attached Anonymous communication, in respect to gambling at #106 North Howard street and #14 N. Eutaw street, I beg to state that there is no such number as #14 North Eutaw street. The Western National Bank is located at this point. At #13 North Eutaw street the upper stories are occupied by the Fourth Ward Democratic Club; cards are played there and if any monies are tolled out of the games the same is applied to the maintainance of the Club and not for the benefit of one or more individuals.

At #106 North Howard street the upper floors are occupied by the Ivanhoe Club, and which Club has been located at this address for many years. The members congregate there and indulge in card playing and whatever monies are tolled from the games goes towards defraying the expenses of the Club; no one member, or members, derive personal benefit from these tolls.

The doors of both the Fourth Ward Democratic and Ivanhoe Clubs are always unlocked and open for our officers to enter and inspect the premises, and which is frequently done by them.

I might also add that both of these clubs are duly incorporated.
