On June 10th. the conductor of this train reported seeing a number of boys on the tracks south of Woodberry, at about the place where the wreck occurred, and yesterday a stone was thrown through the window of our train 73 while passing that point, striking one of our passengers. There is a great deal of trespassing on our tracks between Mt. Vernon and Woodberry, and I should appreciate it if you would issue instructions to your officers to co-operate with ours in an effort to break up the practice.
