In the matter of Patrolmen John F. Dugan and William C. Carter, of the Central District, who were tried June 10, 1912, upon the charge of having been under the influence of liquor, while on active duty, June 8, 1912, as referred to in the proceedings of June 10 and 13, 1912, a report, as follows, was received:

To The Honorable,

The Board of Police Commissioners.

Gentlemen:-

We have the honor to state that after an examination of Patrolmen John F. Dugan and William C. Carter, Central District, we find that Patrolman Dugan is physically sound. In the case of Patrolman Carter, a thickening found at the apices of both lungs, anteriorly and posteriorly indicating that he is probably suffering with tuberculosis. No signs of a drug habit could be made out.
