I am forwarding, herewith, communication received by me from Mrs. Margaret D. Austin, in which she makes complaint against Raleigh J. Feidt, of the Southern District.

Mrs. Austin called upon me sometime ago and made complaint against Patrolman Feidt and I afterwards spoke to Patrolman Feidt and cautioned him as to interfering in matters relating to Mrs. Austin and warned him as to a repetition.

It is apparent that my caution and warning did not have any effect and I have therefore formulated charges against him based on her complaint, copy of which are enclosed.

I would respectfully recommend that he be cited before your Honorable Body upon these charges.

I have retained a duplicate of said charges until such time as your Honorable Body may decide upon a date for a hearing of these charges.
