The Board of Police Commissioners.
Gentlemen:-

In respect to the case of Patrolman Wm. C. Carter, Central District, in regard to whom at our first and subsequent examination we believed that he has evidence of tubercular trouble. There is, however, some doubt in the situation which can only be cleared up by having the man kept under observation. His health generally seems to be good and in our judgment there is no reason why he cannot continue to perform the duties of a patrolman satisfactorily, so far as his mental and physical conditions are concerned. In view of these circumstances we respectfully suggest that he be returned to active duty, and be required to report to Dr. Thomas P. McCormick, in whose medical district he resides, once every two weeks, in order that he may be kept under proper observation. If during this observation it is found that he has tuberculosis definitely; that he is going back, the matter will be again called to the attention of the Board of Police Commissioners.
