Wheels of Fortune.

A delegation representing the West Baltimore Convention Carnival, called upon the Board and complained of the action of the police in stopping the running of what are known as wheels of fortune, the throwing of rings at canes and knives, and the sale of ticklers on the streets of West Baltimore, on account of the West Baltimore Carnival Convention.

The Board told the delegation that the use of wheels of fortune is in violation of law, and that notwithstanding the fact that the employment thereof is intended for a proper purpose, the Board could not sanction their continuance;

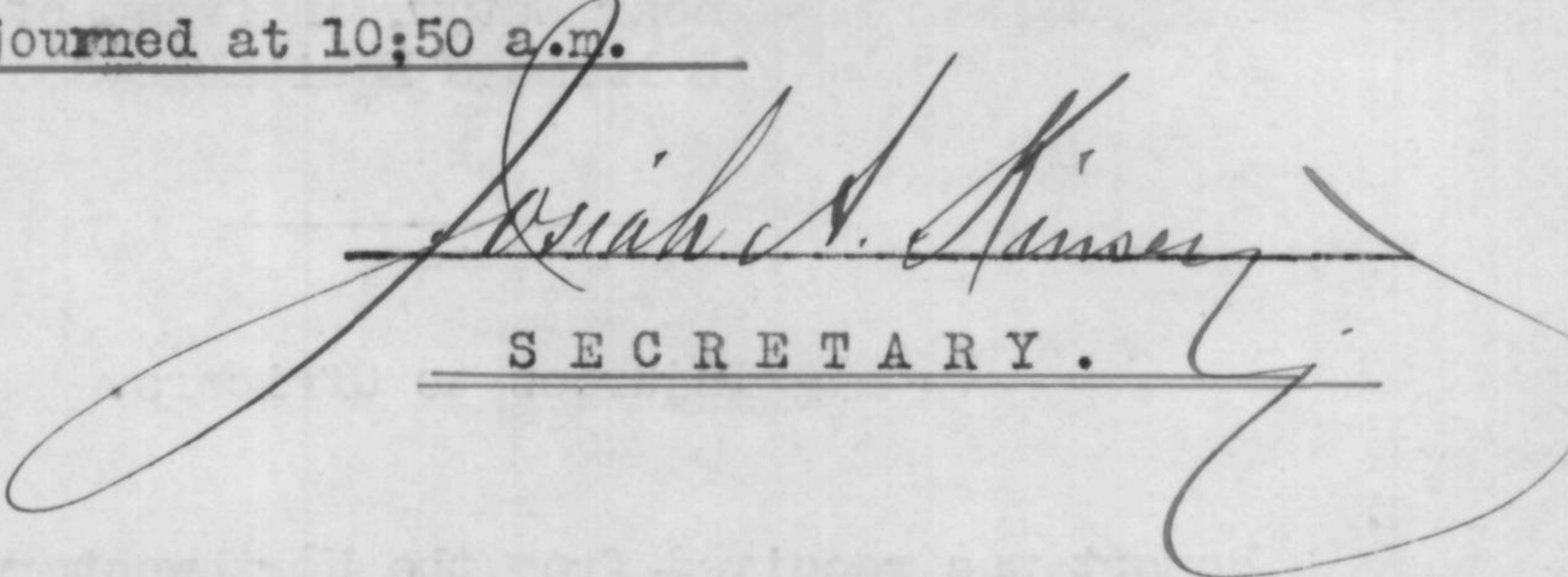
That as to the throwing of rings over canes and knives, such did not seem to be contrary to law and would not be interfered with;

That the sale of ticklers on the streets would not be stopped unless the use thereof became objectionable and tended to create disorder.
