In the matter of Patrolman Carroll E. Bond, surveyed by the Police Physicians and reported upon, as referred to in the proceedings of June 27, 1912, a report, as follows, was received and the recommendation therein contained, approved:-

In the case of Patrolman Carroll E. Bond, who lost his eye as the result of a wound received while on a gunning trip, November 20th., 1911.

At the present time there is a vacancy in the Clerkship at the Mounted Stables, and in view of the recommendation of the Police Physicians that Patrolman Bond is no longer able to do outside police duty, but competent to fill some inside position, I would respectfully recommend that Patrolman Bond be assigned as Clerk at the Mounted Stables.

The Secretary reported that pursuant to the Board's order he had taken the matter up with the State's Attorney and furnished him with all the facts in the premises; that the State's Attorney had again brought the matter to the attention of the Grand Jury and that the Grand Jury on July 2nd., 1912, dismissed the case against Monohan, Bilson and Kavanaugh, the second time.
