CONDUNT UNBECOMING AN OFFICER

AND NEGLECT OF DUTY.

In that he, about 2.30 a.m., July 7th, 1912, in the vicinity of the Middle Section Club, Lexington street between Forrest and East streets, neglected or failed to assist Patrolmen John A. Cooney, James T. Cain, Jr., Henry C. Otto and Frederick Korn, in effecting the arrest of one Eddie Myers, colored, who was resisting arrest, and also failed to assist, at the time and place mentioned, in dispersing a crowd of negroes who had congregated in that neighborhood.

The cases were held under advisement.

Patrolman L. Roche,

Complaint of C. C. Levy.

In respect to the complaint against Patrolman James L. Roche, Northwestern District, made by C. C. Levy, in his communication addressed to the Board under date of July 8th, 1912, that the said patrolman, on July 5th last, denied him admittance to the Northwestern District Station-house when he attempted to enter the building on business, and treated him in an offensive manner on that and a previous occasion elsewhere,

Patrolman Roche was called before the Board. The statements of Mr. Levy were read to him and he denied having treated Mr. Levy in any other than a proper way. He stated that when he refused to allow Mr. Levy to enter the Station-house he was simply acting under the order
