

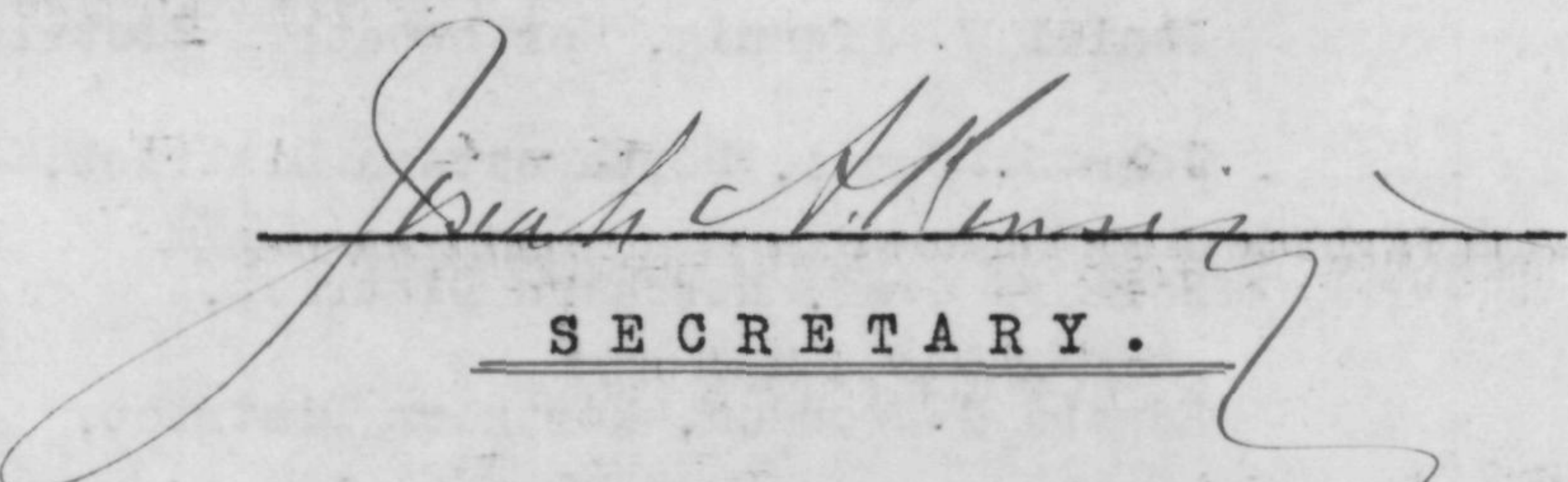
of his captain to keep out persons having no business in the Station, and he disclaimed having acted toward Mr. Levy in an offenseive manner on any occasion, although Mr. Levy had been going to places on the officer's post and declaring his intention of depriving Patrolman Roche of his position in the force.

The Board told Patrolman Roache that from the tone of Mr. Levy's letter it would seem that Levy does not like him and that it appeared to the Board there is danger of the officer's resenting the attitude of Levy and bringing about trouble. He was cautioned against any exhibition of ill feeling toward Levy by act, manner or speech and told that his duty as an officer is to go on about his work and pay no attention to any threats on the part of Levy; to so treat him as to avoid any ground for complaint.
