The minutes of the previous meeting, Wednesday, July 10, 1912,
were read, approved and adopted.

Transfers.

In response to the Board's inquiry, report, as follows, was received:-

The Board of Police Commissioners.

Gentlemen:-

I beg to submit, herewith, the names of six Sergeants, whom I consider efficient in every respect, viz:

Daniel W. Pfennig, Northwestern District,

John J. Burns, Northwestern District,

Bernard Graf, Northern District,

Edward G. Worden, Northern District,

George C. Velker, Southern District,

Mark J. Harrigan, Southwestern District.

In this connection the Marshal was called in. He told the Board that in his judgment Sergeants Bernard Graf and Edward G. Worden, of the Northern District, were both efficient sergeants, but that he looked upon Sergeant Bernard Graf as the more active of the two.

In view of the Marshal's recommendation and to avoid additional transfers, which would be necessary if the selection for transfer were made from any other than the Northern District, it was ordered:

That Sergeant Bernard Graf be transferred from the Northern to the Central District; vice Sergeant Thomas J. O'Neill, transferred from the Central to the Northern District; said transfer to take effect at once.
