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Transfer.

In the matter of vacancy in the Mounted Service, caused by the dismissal of Patrolman Thomas McGrain, a report, as follows, was received:-

"Baltimore, Md., July 10th., 1912.

To The Honorable,

The Board of Police Commissioners.

Gentlemen:-

I beg, respectfully, to forward, herewith, communication of Captain J.E.Moxley, Northern District, which contains a request of Patrolman John E. Kaufman, of the Northern District, for transfer to the Mounted Service to fill the existing vacancy.

In my judgment either Patrolmen James B. Fox or Harry P. Fisher are more qualified to fill the vacancy referred to, and I cannot therefore conscientiously recommend the consideration of Patrolman Kaufman at this time.

It was ordered that Patrolman James B. Fox, Central District, be transferred to the mounted force, vice McGrain; said transfer to take effect at once. (See Transfer File.)

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Trial.
