

"The Board has examined your record and finds that it has not been a clear one. You have failed to answer on time on several occasions, but at the same time we recognize that last night was an exceptionally hot night; that the weather has been exceptionally severe. We want to give equal treatment to all officers. We have excused officers who have been reported as being late for duty up to this time, and we excuse you on this charge. We will take occasion, however, to say that we are very seriously considering the matter of imposing a fine in every case when an officer is late for duty. In that way we think discipline can be best kept up in the force, and we would like to have you understand that, although you are excused this time, in the absence of some special excuse, a fine will in all probability be imposed on you or some other more severe punishment should you be late in the future."

And it was ordered that notice be given the force by publication in the daily lookout sheet of the Board's attitude in the premises.
