

Gentlemen:-

I am enclosing herewith, a copy of a letter, written to the heads of the various City Departments and Public Service Companies, with reference to the Commission's sanitary sewers and storm water drains.

I shall be obliged if you will instruct the members of the Police Force to co-operate with us in this matter by insisting upon the production of a permit in all cases where excavations are made for sewer and drain connections, except where the work is being done by employes of the Sewerage Commission or by our Contractors. The men in charge of all work done directly by the Commission are all provided with badges or other evidence of authority, and our contractors are usually well known to the police.
