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ment in the matter of conducting these services and this department could not, therefore, conscientiously, in any manner interfere with their mode of worship.

I have instructed Captain McGee, however, to keep the place under surveillance and make a further report in the event that they again conduct their services in an unnecessary loud and noisy manner.
