Complaint

Edward Myers, 209 Colvin st.,

The Secretary reported to the Board that on the morning of July 12th., last, Mr. Leigh Bonsal brought Edward Myers, of 209 Colvin street, to the office of the Board, and that the said Edward Myers made to the Secretary a complaint, as follows:-

Between 2:30 and 3 o'clock on Sunday morning, July 7th., last, I was sitting on the steps of 1112 East Lexington st. While sitting there four white men in plain clothes, officers Cain, Cooney, Otto and Korn, came up. I saw them stop at the door of the club house, #1108 E. Lexington st., and try the door. I got up to see who they were and on getting there on the pavement, Officer Cain recognized me and said, "There is Meyers now", and grabbed me. Officer Otto also grabbed me, showed me his star with a black-jack in his hand. He said, "I am an officer and you are under arrest". I submitted and said, "You have not anything on me, I have not done anything". Officer Cain then said, "Lock him up". I said, "All right lock me up", he said "Open this door". I refused to open the door. At that time Officer Cain grabbed my left arm and Officer Cooney my right, and said "We'll make you open the door". He asked me again "Are you going to open it", and I said "No".
