

Gentlemen:-

With a view of determining how the liquor law was being observed at the various places, operated under a Hotel License, I detailed 18 officers (including Miss Harvey) to visit these places with a view of ascertaining whether or not the law was being violated, on Sunday, July 14th., 1912.

In the make-up of this detail I selected officers to operate in districts other than their own in order that there would be a lesser possibility of their being recognized. I also selected such hours for these visits when I thought they were doing most of their business.

From the reports herewith submitted it will be observed that there were violations (in my judgment) at the following named places, viz:

Hotel Lexington, Holliday & Lexington sts.

The dining room of the Hotel Conway, 612 E. Lombard st., closes at 6 p.m., and the hour selected for a visit to this hotel being 8 p.m., the officer was consequently refused service.
