Additional Police Justices.
Pay of.

In respect to the pay of additional Police Justices, as referred to in the proceedings of May 29th., 1912, communication, as follows, was received, together with the opinion of Judge Walter I. Dawkins, as hereunder:

"Baltimore, July 15th., 1912.

Board of Police Commissioners,

Court House, City.

Gentlemen:-

Under cover herewith find a copy of the opinion of Judge Dawkins in the matter of the pay of the two additional police justices.

The Judge seems to have used a part of my argument, without adopting my conclusions. I urged upon him that it was an unreasonable construction to say that the pay of the police justices regularly assigned should be abated for each day over thirty days in each year, that he fails to serve, and at the same time the two additional police justices should receive full pay, although serving possibly, as little time as one hundred and twenty days, being one half of the two hundred and forty days leave allowed the eight regular police justices.
