

Gentlemen:-

I beg, respectfully, to report the following raids and arrests yesterday (Sunday), July 14th., 1912, viz:

Saloon of Frank S. Frazier, 623-625 S. Luzern st: two witnesses; Released for Court on Bail; Patrolman Morgareth, Command and Gordon, Eastern District.

Martin P. Smith, 823-1/2 Harford ave., charged with the sale of intoxicating liquors to Daniel Pervines and Mary Oakley, both colored, who claimed to have purchased said liquors from Smith; Smith released for Court; Sergt. N.B. Gatch and Patrolman James S. Holden, Northeastern District.

John Pfeifer, (saloon), 227 N. Washington st: six witnessed; Pfeifer released for Court; Sergt. M.B. Phillips and Patrolmen Lennon and McCabe, Northeastern District.

Frederick Dorsch, (saloon), 1800 E. Chase st: five witnesses; Dorsch was charged with selling and furnishing liquor on Sunday; allowing an entrance to his saloon other than the regular public traveledway and two cases of selling intoxicating liquors to two minors, 18 and 19 years of age respectively; committed to Jail awaiting action by the Grand Jury on all three cases; Rd. Sergt. Whittle, Patrolmen Mahoney and Busky, Northeastern District. (NOTE: Dorsch was fined \$50. and costs, May 8th., last, charged with selling intoxicating liquors on Sunday, April 8, 1912.)

Joseph Milner was arrested charged with working on Sunday, July 14th., 1912 (cutting cloth at #424 W. Baltimore street), fined \$5. and costs, and released; Sergt. J.J. Murphy and Patrolman John F. Tevis, Western District.

James Kelly (saloon), 1226-28 Penna. avenue; William Brown, colored, arrested charged with managing a gaming table; committed for action of the Grand Jury; thirteen negroes arrested on charge of playing craps, each fined \$1. and costs. Warrant has been sworn out for Kelly who is still at large; Rd. Sergt. Smith, Sergeant Pfennig, Patrolmen Santry, Sellman and Raine, Northwestern District.
