Beggars. - Vagrants.
Federated Charities.
St. Vincent De Paul Society.

In the matter of the apprehension, detention, etc., of street beggars and vagrants, as presented to the Board by the representatives of the charity organizations, as referred to in the proceedings of June 4th., 17th., July 9th., and 13th., 1912, it was ordered:

That, for the purpose of "cleaning up" beggars and vagrants in the city at this time, each of the police districts assign one suitable patrolman to work temporarily therein, -- say for two weeks, -- as the mendicancy officer for the district, under the plan agreed upon in the meeting of those interested in the matter, mentioned in the proceedings of July 13th. last, as outlined in the communication from the charity organizations of June 4th., and in the paper filed in Exhibit No. 3951.

That cases of vagrants and beggars coming under the observation of members of the uniformed force in the several districts be by them brought through the captain of the district, to the attention of the officer specially assigned to this work, together with the names and addresses obtained.

That after the expiration of the special assignment, such mendicancy work be left to the regularly detailed mendicancy officer or officers; and

That, to insure a proper and uniform understanding of the details of the duties of the officers assigned in the districts temporarily as above, the officers so selected be brought to headquarters, upon a date to be hereafter fixed, to be addressed on the subject by the Board and representatives of the charity or-
