"Baltimore, Md., July 22nd., 1912.

To The Honorable,

The Board of Police Commissioners.

Gentlemen -

I beg, respectfully, to report the following liquor saloons which we raided yesterday, Sunday, July 21st., 1912, viz:

Frederick Nordenholz, 1013 W. Lexington street; three witnesses and six bottles of beer as evidence; Nordenholz released on bail for court: Sergt. Carberry, Patrolmen Pease and Hodges, Southwestern District.

Niels P. Clausen, 641 S. Montford avenue; four witnesses George A. Heiminauer and David Kissner, two of the witnesses, were committed for the action of the Grand Jury on the charge of perjury by falsely swearing to material facts; Round Sergeant Riefner, Sergt. Mintiens and three plain clothes officers, (Officers Henry J. Morgareth, Albert S. Gordon and Michael B. Command), all of the Eastern District. (Clausen released on bail for Court).

Kahl's Pavillion, Ferry Bar, evidence 15 glasses of beer (half filled), 7 bottles of beer and 11 bottles of beer, half filled; witnesses 46 white men and 3 women. Ernest H. Trenth, who holds a Baltimore County license for this place was arrested, charged with selling liquor on Sunday in Baltimore City, also without a license; Trenth was released on bail for the action of the Criminal Court of Baltimore City; Frederick W. Kahl was arrested for working on Sunday and released on bail for Court; Sergeants Ursprucht, Ramsey and Schulte, and a number of other officers, all of the Southern District.
