In connection with the attached application of Rev. W.D. Wood, Pastor, Galilee Colored M.E.Church, to conduct religious services under a tent erected on lot #1607-9-11 N. Mount street, beg to say that I referred this matter to Captain J. J. Santry, Northwestern District, for investigation, and ^{he} reports that while there are a few objections on the part of residents on Baker street, which is some distance from the point where these services are to be conducted, yet in view of the fact that the location where the tent is to be erected is within what is known as a "mixed block", he does not see why the request of Rev. Wood should be refused.
