

sonally inspected the Police Patrol Boat 'Farnan', and after carefully going over this boat I find that the repairs as suggested by Captain E.J.Carey (and which are enumerated in his report hereto attached), are absolutely necessary.

Captain Carey informs me that in order that the Farnan may be put into proper shape for service, it will entail an expense of about \$300.00.

I am further informed by Captain Carey that the Farnan in its present condition is not fit to put into active service, and in the event of a mishap occurring to the Lannan we would be without a police boat, unless another boat to perform the services of the Lannan is engaged, which, I understand, would cost at least \$25.00 per day.

I would therefore respectfully recommend that the Farnan be given an immediate overhauling.
