Pay Roll.

A communication, as follows, was handed the Board by the Secretary:

Dear Sir:-

It has occurred to me that matters would be greatly facilitated, not only from our standpoint, but from the standpoint of the payees, if, instead of issuing a certificate for each magistrate's salary each month, you prepare a pay-roll with the names of all of the magistrates and their salaries printed thereon and certified to, the salaries due all the magistrates on the one form, sending the form to this office two or three days before the end of the month, so that we could arrange to have the magistrates paid in cash at the office of the City Register the first of each month.

I send you herewith a pay-roll form I have had in operation for sometime for salaries of the City Councilmen, and you can understand that our work has been greatly lessened by the use of this pay-roll form, rather than preparing a receipt, warrant, and check for each and every Councilman. The Councilmen now call at the office of the City Register on the first of the month, and are paid in cash,
