Reverend Jennette Johns.
Application for permission to hold
Religious Services.

Report, as follows, was received:-

"Baltimore, Md., August 8th., 1912.

To The Honorable,

The Board of Police Commissioners.

Gentlemen:-

In returning, herewith, application of Rev. Jennette Johns (colored), to hold gospel meetings from a wagon upon the streets of Baltimore which are designated as "colored blocks", beg to say that I can see no objection to granting this permission, provided, of course, that they hold these meetings in such streets and places where it will not conflict with the Segregation Ordinance, and furthermore that the holding of these meetings are conducted in an orderly manner.

Should we find after a time that these meetings are a source of annoyance or are in any manner the means of creating disturbances the application can be revoked at once. I would therefore respectfully recommend that Rev. Johns' application be granted.
