To The Honorable,

The Board of Police Commissioners.

Gentlemen:-

In connection with the attached Anonymous communication, in which complaint is made that women loiter in the neighborhood of Calhoun and Lombard streets for the purpose of enticing young men, beg to say that I referred this matter to Cap't Thomas B. McGee, Southwestern District, with instructions to at once institute an investigation and if the conditions were such as alleged to take steps immediately to have this practice abated.

As will be noted from the attached report of Cap't McGee the sergeant working this bailiwick was unable to find, or learn of, any such condition as stated in the Anonymous communication, but that he will keep this territory under surveillance in the future and prevent any such conduct on the part of young girls and boys.
