Meehan, representing the American Bonding Company, the sum of Fifty Dollars, as a reward for services rendered the said company, and failed to deposit the said money with the Board of Police Commissioners, as required by Rule 34 of the Rules and Regulations of the Police Department, and by the provisions of Section 750, Public Local Laws, Article 4, (Charter).

And in that he on August 13, 1912, made false statements to the Board of Police Commissioners, Court House, in relation thereto.

Detective Lancaster admitted, in writing, that the charge of official misconduct, as above, was true.
