Trials.

Patrolman Michael J. Reynolds, Northwestern District, reported for having been twenty-four minutes late calling in to the station, going off duty, August 13, 1912, was excused.

Patrolman Joseph H. Krastell, Northwestern District, was tried upon the charge of having been ten minutes behind his squad, coming in off duty, 4:20 a.m., August 13, 1912, and asleep on his post, found guilty of the said charge and ordered deprived of four days leave of absence.

Patrolman Henry W. Webster, Western District, was tried upon charge, as follows, found guilty thereof, and fined \$10.

C h a r g e :

"Being off his post, and in the saloon of Agnes Macis, 111 Penn street, drinking intoxicating liquor, while on active duty, at about 9:50 a.m., August 13th., 1912."

Patrolman Alonzo W. Lockwood.
Policemen Engaged in other Occupation.

In the matter of Patrolman Alonzo W. Lockwood, Northeastern District, who was tried August 9, 1912, upon charges, as follows:

FIRST.....Violating Section 16, Rule 28, Rules and Regulations of the Department, in that on Sunday, August 4, 1912, and prior thereto, he engaged in other business; that of the practice of dentistry on premises 1839 Harford avenue, Baltimore City.

SECOND.....Violating Section 1, Article 32, Public Civil Laws, in that he engaged, as above, in the practice of dentistry without a license.
