Transfers.

Upon the recommendation of Captain Jonathan E. Moxley, approved by the Marshal, it was ordered that Patrolmen Henry H. Horstman and Patrick W. McLain, Northern District, be transferred from B. to A. Division; vice Tippet, transferred and Crowe, retired; said transfers to take effect at once.

O'Donnell, Northern District, were permitted to retain \$30.50, (\$25 and \$5.50 expenses), of a \$50. check received from the United States Government, for the apprehension and delivery of John Higgins, a deserter from the United States Army. The balance of said check was ordered
