Sergt. Adelbert Plantholt, Sergeant Charles H. Burns and Patrolmen Klingenberg and Heineman were detailed to visit all hotels east of Charles street and Sergt. Henry Donhouser and Sergeant F.R. Gatch and Patrolmen Charles H. Finch and Frederick Korn were detailed to visit all hotels west of Charles street. (See attached list.
