

Rewards and Donations.

It was ordered that the \$50.00 paid as a reward by the authorities of Montgomery, Ala., for the apprehension of J. Monroe Lammons, charge with embezzlement, be divided, as follows:

To Miss B. V. Dryden of Montgomery, Ala., from whom information was received leading to the arrest.....	\$20.00
To Detectives Joseph E. Coughlin and George W. Davis, who made the arrest, \$10.00 each.....	20.00
To the SPECIAL FUND.....	10.00

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In connection with the subject of rewards paid and donations given members of the Police Department for services rendered, the Board adopted a rule, as follows:

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That in instances where the amount of the reward or donation is \$10.00 or less, that the entire amount thereof be returned to the officer;

That in instances where the amount is greater than \$10.00, it be divided one-half plus necessary expenses, to the officer and the remainder to the Special Fund, the understanding being that in such cases the officer shall receive not less than \$10.00.

This rule not to apply where a person outside of the Police Department shall be considered by the Board as entitled to a part of the reward or donation; all such cases to be decided by the Board on their own merits.
