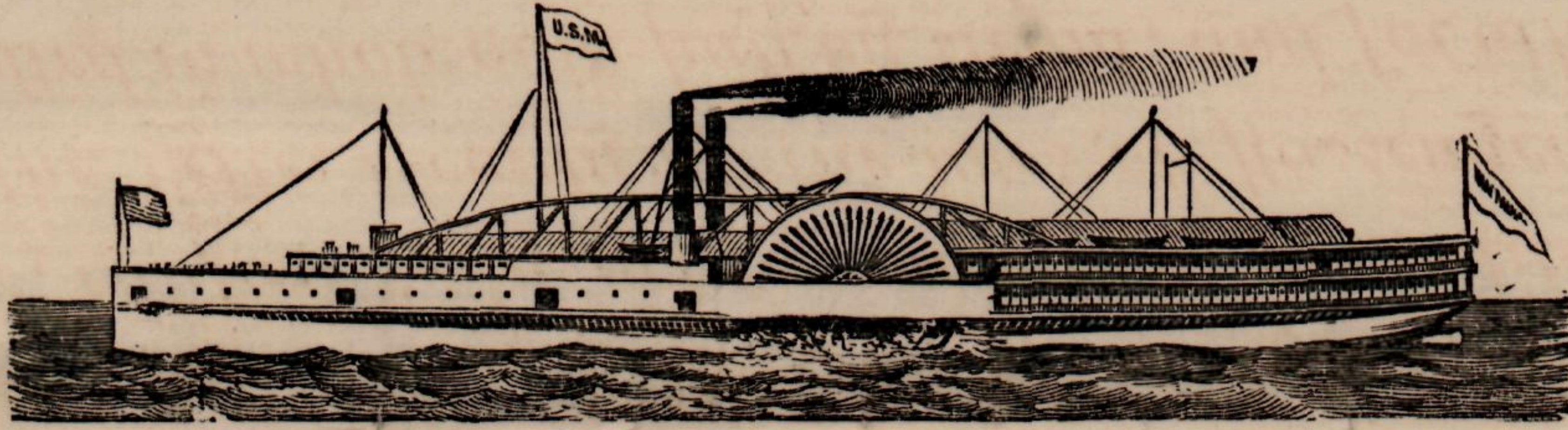


STEAMBOAT PILOT'S CERTIFICATE
