A protested Bill in the hands of Mr Grahame or Mr Richmond for Mr Russell 160 or 170 £ Sterling I think belong^g & pay^{ble} to One Mr Spence at Edinb^g — drawn by Mr Mepherson & Indorsed by G. Gordon — say 180. —

These are very large Sums, and if are to go out of George Gordons Estate, both Real & Personal will fall short to pay them and Mr Gordons own Debts — so that it is extremely necessary for Mr John Gordon to enquire into these Matters & obtain Satisfaction from Mr Mepherson — who — surely ought to pay his own Debts —

It will be absolutely necessary to know from Mr Mepherson. —

- 1st What other engagements besides the above, George Gordon is bound for with him — & how and when they are to be satisfied & complied with on Mr Mephersons part
- 2^d how the Affair of the £300 borrowed of the Bank of Edinb^g was paid or settled, and what was the Real State of the Cudbear Manufacture when Mr Mepherson left Scotland — what was G & Gs Share at least & how secured — a clear State of this matter is greatly wanted.
- 3^d What Accounts hath Mr Mepherson received of that Affair since he left Scotland & what is its present situation —
- 4th What Acco^{ts} are there between Mr Mepherson & Mr Gordon and how circumstanced.
