

judgement in selling Mr. Williams' claim against Mr. Baton, in that manner which you think would most promote Mr. Williams' interest, and I am confident any thing you might do for him, during his absence, that you thought most to his advantage, would meet his decided approbation. Should you find that Baton is determined to go to Alexandria and give himself up, I think it would be advisable to settle with him on the best terms you could, without you should think there was a prospect of recovering something from him after his body is released, as I understand the act of Congress only release his body and not his future effects.
