General News Notes.

John T. Raymond, the celebrated actor, died at Annapolis, Md., on Sunday.

Mrs. Anna J. Pugh has purchased the Hygeia Hotel, at Fort Monmouth, Va., for \$350,000.

Rev. T. DeWitt Talbot will deliver the address before the Virginia Bible Society, in Richmond, April 25.

A movement has been set on foot in the democratic party in Philadelphia to defeat ex-Speaker Randall's reelection to Congress.

The Secretary of the Navy has invited sealed proposals from the shipbuilders of the United States for building five new vessels.

Mr. William Gould, of Spaulding's Neck, who is the pioneer coal-miner in this section of the country, commenced pitting his crop last week.

Marshall Parks, of Norfolk, Va., has been appointed steamboat inspector in place of James Curran, of Maryland, who failed of confirmation by the Senate.

There was another earthquake shock at Charleston last Sunday morning. While it did no damage, it was severe enough to startle people from their beds and to frighten early churchgoers.

Six out of seventeen prisoners confined in Cambridge, Md., jail escaped about half-past eight o'clock Monday night during the temporary absence of the sheriff, and at last accounts had not been re-captured.

There will be displayed at the coming American Exhibition in London, England, by 50,000 of which the foundation timbers, flooring, sheathing, roofing, everything included, including the chimney, will be made of iron.

It is daily becoming apparent that the prohibition of the liquor traffic not only prohibits the sale of intoxicants, but at the same time a large proportion of all vice and crime as well as a recent meeting of sheriffs in Iowa, recently being held, it was unanimously decided that the present prohibitory law had decreased crime business at least fifty per cent.

The schooner John R. Cook, plying between Kent Island and Baltimore, was stranded on a heavy storm of Tuesday week and strained so badly that a plank was started, causing a leak of such dimensions that the vessel was forced to leave the mouth of the Patuxent river. The schooner had 1,400 bushels of grain aboard, the most of which belonged to Messrs. Walter K. White and H. C. Norman, of Kent Island. She was owned by parties in Baltimore.

The fifth anniversary of the organization of Carroll county was celebrated at Westminster on Monday. The occasion brought together about 16,000 people from nearly all sections of Western Maryland. There was an interesting parade of fire companies, trades and citizens, and orations were delivered by Col. W. P. Massey and Dr. J. M. Haring. Carroll county is one of the most fertile and productive counties in the State, and its people are entitled to entertain the local pride which they manifest.

The officials of the Pan-Handle Railroad have been employed on the road between Pittsburgh and Delmar, and have engaged in the systematic theft of goods from the freight cars, and on Monday caused the arrest of a large number of the alibi in connection with the fact that for three years past the Pan-Handle Railroad has been systematically robbed, and it is estimated that at least \$200,000 of goods have been taken, for which the company had to pay. All kinds of goods were stolen, including sewing machines, guns, revolvers, cutlery, silverware, cigars, clothing, liquor, groceries, furniture, and in fact, every imaginable article that can be carried in a car, were rapidly removed. The depredations were committed all along the road, at points as far west as Denver.

DELAWARE STOCKS TO THE BARRETS.—At a meeting of the peninsula growth growers at Smyrna, Delaware, Saturday, a resolution was adopted requesting the railroad authorities to permit the charges on return barrels, and declaring a purpose, if such remission cannot be obtained, to present the subject to the Interstate Commerce Commission. It was further resolved "that such barrels, whether made of wood or paper or other material, and whether reduced in price or through the competition of manufacturers, shall not be given away by our commission men, and that no matter how low the prices may be, we shall insist on the return of barrels to the grower, and will not accept barrels of mixed materials."

SALE OF A HOTEL.—The Mansion House hotel, on Fayette and St. Paul streets, Baltimore, was sold at public auction on Tuesday. This property has been occupied as a hotel since 1841. Mr. Jesse Albertson having been the proprietor of it since 1874. The hotel has a capital of \$100,000, and is a first-class building, with a grand front of 116 feet, with a ground rent of only \$200 on a portion of the lot, and is a fine simple. The office and tenements surrounding the premises bring a rental of \$4,000 per annum. The first bid offered was \$50,000. It ran up to \$90,000, when it was bought by John Quinn bid up to \$93,000, and then stopped, and it was bought by Mr. David C. White for \$93,500. Mr. White bought it as an investment, and says he doesn't know what will be done with it, but will probably be continued as a hotel.

Gov. Hill, of New York, has vetoed the high license bill on the ground that it applied only to New York and Brooklyn and the representatives from those cities opposed it. Other cities in the State which had more liquor shops proportionally to population refused to have the bill apply to them but insisted upon the application to New York and Brooklyn, which the Governor thought unfair. It is true that both the whiskey men and the prohibitionists in New York and Brooklyn, then the Governor has vetoed both.

Death of Bishop Lee. The Right Rev. Alfred Lee, Bishop of the Diocese of Delaware and Presiding Bishop of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States, died at his residence in Wilmington Tuesday afternoon. Bishop Lee was taken ill on March 4 with typhoid fever. His death was gradual and easy. The funeral was held on Friday, at 2 P. M., in St. Andrew's Church, and the burial was made in Old Sweden Cemetery, where lie the remains of his wife. The death of Bishop Lee leaves Bishop John Williams of the Diocese of Connecticut, as the senior bishop of the Protestant Episcopal Church.

The Morning News says: The death of Bishop Lee of this city removes from Wilmington one of our noblest and most estimable citizens. For forty-six years he has gone in and out among us, leading a blameless life. In all those traits of character, which elicit general respect and admiration, and which have made him a friend and held private confidence he was pre-eminent. The sincerity, the gentleness and the benign high-mindedness of his daily walk and conversation were obvious to all. His sweet and sympathetic and noble qualities of mind had been added to his high ecclesiastical position as a bishop in the Protestant Episcopal Church which he so admirably and nobly filled. He administered the duties of his office with the ideal of St. Paul, who, in writing to Timothy, described the office of a minister as "good work." To do good, and to promote well doing among others, were the sole ends at which Bishop Lee aimed. His aims were varied and broad, and his preaching simple and practical. His piety was unaffected, and one of his greatest joys was in the company of a good man. His goodness was the living and affection of children as well as the admiration and loving trust of a mature mind. In short, Bishop Lee was a man who made personal Christianity lovely and attractive in every way, just as it was intended to be, and just as always is when it is permitted to impregnate the source of a man's life with its gentle and benign qualities.
