GENERAL NEWS NOTES.

Wm. H. Pratt, Jr., was struck on the head by a horse on Monday last week and lingered until the following Friday, when he succumbed to the effects of the attack.

Wm. G. Horey, a prominent citizen of Denton, died on the 27th ult., aged 69 years. He was elected to the Legislature in 1867 and afterwards served as county commissioner. He was a director in the Denton National Bank, of which he was one of the founders.

Gov. Foraker has been renominated by the republican state convention of Ohio, and a platform adopted containing an endorsement of Senator Sherman as a presidential candidate.

Mr. Higgins, one of the best known and wealthiest farmers in Delaware, died at the residence of his son, in Odessa, Saturday night. He was in his 78th year, and was formerly prominent in public matters, and served a term in the Legislature.

Dr. James L. Bryan, of Cambridge, Del., who has been elected president of the Maryland Agricultural College, to succeed J. Augustine Smith, who recently resigned.

Justice Bradley has decided the Bar and Kill bridge case in favor of the Bar, and has dissolved the injunction.

Masses, Errors.—Notwithstanding the fact that the peach yellows has been called to order with a goodly attendance.

The prevalence of the peach yellows was the subject of much discussion; many becoming alarmed at the spread of this disease, others taking a more hopeful view.

E. B. Pennington called to mind the ravages of this disease at Still Pond, Del., forty years ago. For a time the whole section suffered from its blighting effects.

There was a cessation of the trouble for six or eight years, when it again broke out, again after which its reappearance so disastrous and disfigured farmers that most of the orchards were abandoned.

Mr. Pennington claimed that last season augmented this disease. The very heavy crops and the excessive heat of the season had the fruit prematurely, producing rot and scalding the trees.

W. D. Pennington observed that the trees that shed the fruit last year look best now on both low and high land.

J. F. Wilson is of opinion that wet seasons foster yellows.

All present seemed to be impressed with the importance of destroying all trees showing the least sign of yellows, as this disease is contagious—the trees nearest those affected taking the disease first. The opinion prevailed that the spread of this contagion was caused by the pollen from the diseased trees falling on the healthy ones.

For instance: If the prevailing winds were from the northwest during the time of distribution of the pollen, the southwest would be fertilized with the poisonous pollen and become diseased.

One noted case of this disease at Still Pond, Del., was that of a peach orchard owned by Mr. Pennington. Forty years ago, it was a healthy one, but in 1847, it was struck by the disease.

Four trees, three years old, were affected last year and the owner, Mr. E. B. Pennington, at the time of the attack, was in the orchard and saw the disease.

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JACKSON AT HOME.

NOTED FOR HIS NOMINATION.
