MARYLAND FINANCIERS.

The report of the committee of the House of Delegates appointed to investigate the "wrecking of the sinking fund" made their report last week. The majority report, signed Messrs. J. S. Gittings, A. H. Greenfield, Levin F. Morris, E. E. Jackson, Duncan Veazy and E. M. Kirkland, democratic members, and Robt. B. DeLoach and C. L. Wilson, republican members. Both reports are long, and very different in their findings.

The first report deals with the subject of the differences between the Governor and the comptroller of the treasury in regard to the responsibility for the misappropriation and destruction of the sinking funds required by the constitution and provided by law for the redemption of the State loans.

The committee, without entering into the constitutional question raised by the Governor in his message, acquit the treasury officials—the comptroller and treasurer—of blame in the matter. These officers have simply obeyed the mandates of the law-making power in honoring the drafts made upon them by authority of the Legislature.

Since the article in the JOURNAL two weeks ago which noticed the approaching nominations for judges in this circuit and advocated the renomination of the present bench, nearly the whole press compressed in the circuit has joined in urging their retention by the Democratic convention to meet this summer.
