

## FIFTY CENTS OF EVERY BEER DOLLAR GOES FOR TAXES

Brewers Assessed to 50% Of Their Gross Income in Support Of Government.

Maryland brewers pay one-half their gross income to the government in the form of taxes. This figure of 50 cents on the dollar was just released by Mr. George H. Hocker, Secretary of the Brewers Institute of Maryland, on the basis of the new increased taxes and a revised breakdown of the brewery dollar.

This one-half of every dollar income is divided among federal, state and local governments in the form of 24 direct or indirect taxes. Largest of these is the direct federal tax on sales, which for the year ending October 31st required Maryland brewers to pay \$6,499,997.00 to the federal government. The direct tax paid the states on Maryland beer for this same period reached a new high of \$1,002,939.48; the two together totalling over seven-and-a-half million dollars.

**Lists Taxes**  
Other taxes include Brewers' Special Tax, Wholesale and Retail Tax Stamps, State and Federal Unemployment and Old Age Benefits, State and Federal Income Taxes, Telephone and Telegraph Taxes, Capital Stock Tax, Manufacturers' Tax, State and Local Real Estate Tax, State and Local Personal Property Tax, Franchise Tax, Corporation Tax, Automobile Tinting Tax, Minor Privilege Tax, State and Federal Gasoline Tax, Electricity Tax, Lubricating Oil Tax, Automobile Tax.

All of these items go to make up the 50% of its income that each Maryland brewery pays to the governments in taxes.
