"To a Union Man the picket line is both Flag and Bible." This motto printed on a wall in C. I. O. headquarters at Bethlehem, Pa., was photographed and printed in almost every daily newspaper in the United States.

At a time when every ounce of energy in this nation should be directed toward national defense, there are forces at work which would undermine the very foundation of our country.

Our entire program can be thrown into jeopardy by strikes called by selfish-union leaders. That the workers themselves do not want to strike has been demonstrated clearly many times. It is the highly paid organizers, who are strangely enough fostered and protected by the very government they would destroy, who are largely to blame. These men put their own personal gain above the flag, above the Bible.

While young men must sacrifice good jobs and the comforts of home to train for the slaughter at a dollar a day, labor leaders seeing only that the heavy demand for products will force acceptance to their wishes, are attempting to profit by this situation.

BEER-DRINKING IN BRITAIN NOW 2200 YEARS OLD

"One of the many things we owe to Britain," says Mrs. George H. Hocker, Secretary of the Brewers Institute of Maryland, "is its perpetuation, through twenty-two centuries, of beer-enjoyment for civilized men and women of good cheer."

The earliest record of beer as it concerns British people dates from the first contact of the Greeks with this country in 300 B. C., when they found the Ancient Britons' chief beverage to be beer, Mr. Hocker's research revealed.

As time went along in Britain, beer gradually became a Church industry, and was such until well into medieval times. The Bakery and the Brewery usually adjoined in the monastery. The cause of the monks securing control of the beer industry is simple; cleanliness, an essential to the successful brewing of the beverage, was a characteristic of these men, hence they undoubtedly brewed better and more consistently than their domestic competitors and the business gratified to them.

At an early date, the brewers (mostly monks) formed an association which was given the title of "The Guild of Our Lady and Thomas a Beckett, which lasted until 1438, when it was formally changed to "The Mystery of Brewers." The oldest company book in existence is a treasured possession today of Brewers' Hall, London . . . the record of the brewers from 1418 to 1440.

"Maryland Brewers are doing their share to keep alive the noble tradition of beer, the moderation beverage," said Mr. Hocker.
