

### Duck Hunting Season To Stay at 60 Days

A 60-day duck hunting season was proclaimed by Secretary of the Interior Ickes on Wednesday, starting October 1 in the Northern States and November 2 in Southern States. Maryland is included in the Southern classification.

In issuing 1941 regulations for hunting migratory game birds, Ickes left unchanged the 60-day season and the 10-a-day bag limit of last year, retained the prohibition against use of bait or live decoys, but added a clause forbidding the taking of water fowl by using cattle, horses or mules as blinds.

As in recent years, hunters must plug repeating and automatic shotguns to a limit of three shells and must not use guns larger than 10-gauge. Hunting with bows and arrows is still permissible. Shooting hours remain the same, sunrise to 4 p. m.

A drastic reduction was ordered in the shooting season for mourning doves, because, Ickes said, the number of these birds was found to be "decidedly unsatisfactory." Whereas the season in some areas ran as long as seventy-seven days, this year's season was reduced to a maximum of forty-two days. The system of split seasons in many areas was eliminated.

Other major changes from last year effective in Maryland included:

A closed season on Wilson snipe, commonly known as jacksnipe.

A ten-day limit on canvasback and ruddy ducks, formerly limited to three a day.

Legalizing the shooting and possession of one wood duck per hunter in Pennsylvania, Delaware, Kentucky, Missouri, Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi, Arkansas, Louisiana and Texas.

### Ten Rules For

#### Bicycle Riders

Bicycle riders, attention! To help in reducing bike accidents, the Keystone Automobile Club has formulated a set of ten rules, observance of which, the Club safety experts declare, will make cycling safer without in any way minimizing its enjoyment.

Here they are:  
1. Obey all traffic signals, signs and rules. Observance of 'stop' signs is important, because motorists on 'through' streets are unprepared for sudden appearance of bicycles from side streets or highways.

2. Ride in single file. There is grave danger when groups of cyclists ride three or four abreast on heavily traveled roads.

3. Keep out of car tracks and ruts. Numerous accidents are due to riders being thrown from bikes in front of oncoming traffic.

4. Don't do 'stunts' or 'race' in traffic.

5. Don't carry a passenger or permit children on roller skates to hang on for a ride.

6. Always signal intention to make right or left turns.

7. Make repairs off the traveled portion of the roadway.

8. 'Walk' the bike across heavy traffic unless it is controlled by officer or traffic light.

9. Don't 'hitch' rides on trucks or other vehicles.

10. Always keep brakes and front and rear lights in good operating condition.

### Shore Finally Getting a Break

Horace M. Morgan, of Queen Anne, Talbot county, and Harry Y. George, of Brunswick, Frederick county, Wednesday were appointed members of the State Board of Education by Governor O'Connor. The Governor also reappointed Dr. J. M. T. Finney to the board. The two appointments were made to fill vacancies.

The appointment of Mr. Morgan is considered important from a geographical standpoint, for its ends a controversy over representation from the Eastern Shore.

Governor O'Connor, commenting on this phase of the matter, said: "Incidentally, the appointment of Mr. Morgan disposes of the question of Eastern Shore representation on the State Board. The Legislature passed a law making it mandatory upon the Governor to appoint a member from the Eastern Shore."

### Horse Show at Salisbury

The second annual horse show for the benefit of old Green Hill P. E. Church will be held at Willowbrook Farms, near the church, on Labor Day.

Sixteen events are listed and three trophies are at stake. The trophies include a championship cup, to be won three times by the same owner for permanent possession; the saddle horse challenge trophy, also a three-leg cup, and a children's horsemanship trophy.

Proceeds of the show are devoted to the restoration of the historic old brick church, erected on the banks of the Wicomico River in 1733. Funds last year were devoted to preservation of the old wood panelling in the church and repairs to its brickwork.

### Caroline Poor Farm

#### Equipment at Auction

Equipment and livestock at the Caroline county poor farm will be sold September 4, the County Commissioners announced Tuesday.

Finding that they could maintain the seven poor farm inmates more economically elsewhere, the County Commissioners recently decided to rent the poor farm to Harvey G. Harris, of Denton.

Sheriff William E. Andrews, of Denton, will auction off ten horses fifteen cows, twenty sheep, fourteen hogs, farm machinery, harness milk equipment and miscellaneous farming utensils and household articles.
