

Record Turkey Crop Predicted in Delaware

Delaware's turkey crop this fall will be the largest in history with a ten per cent increase over production of last year, the Agricultural Marketing Service reported.

That State's 130,000 birds going to market is still far below Maryland's reduced production of 478,000. The Maryland turkey output is two per cent down this year.

Thanksgiving and Christmas diners will find more meat on their birds, with the average live weight about a quarter of a pound heavier than last year. Hens are averaging about 12.2 pounds, while toms are 18.3. Market forecasts indicate that the turkey flocks will be moved earlier this year, with fifty-four per cent to be sold in November. An increased proportion of the birds will be held over this winter as breeding flocks.

Robert Reeves Price

Mr Price was a member of a well-known Queen Anne's county family and was former owner of the Centreville Ice Company, which he sold last year because of his health. He later served with the Internal Revenue Department in Baltimore.

HARRY L. COULTER, Plaintiff VS. FLORENCE H. COULTER, Defendant

The object of this suit is to procure a Decree of Divorce A Vinculo Matrimonii by the Plaintiff, Harry L. Coulter, from the Defendant, Florence H. Coulter.

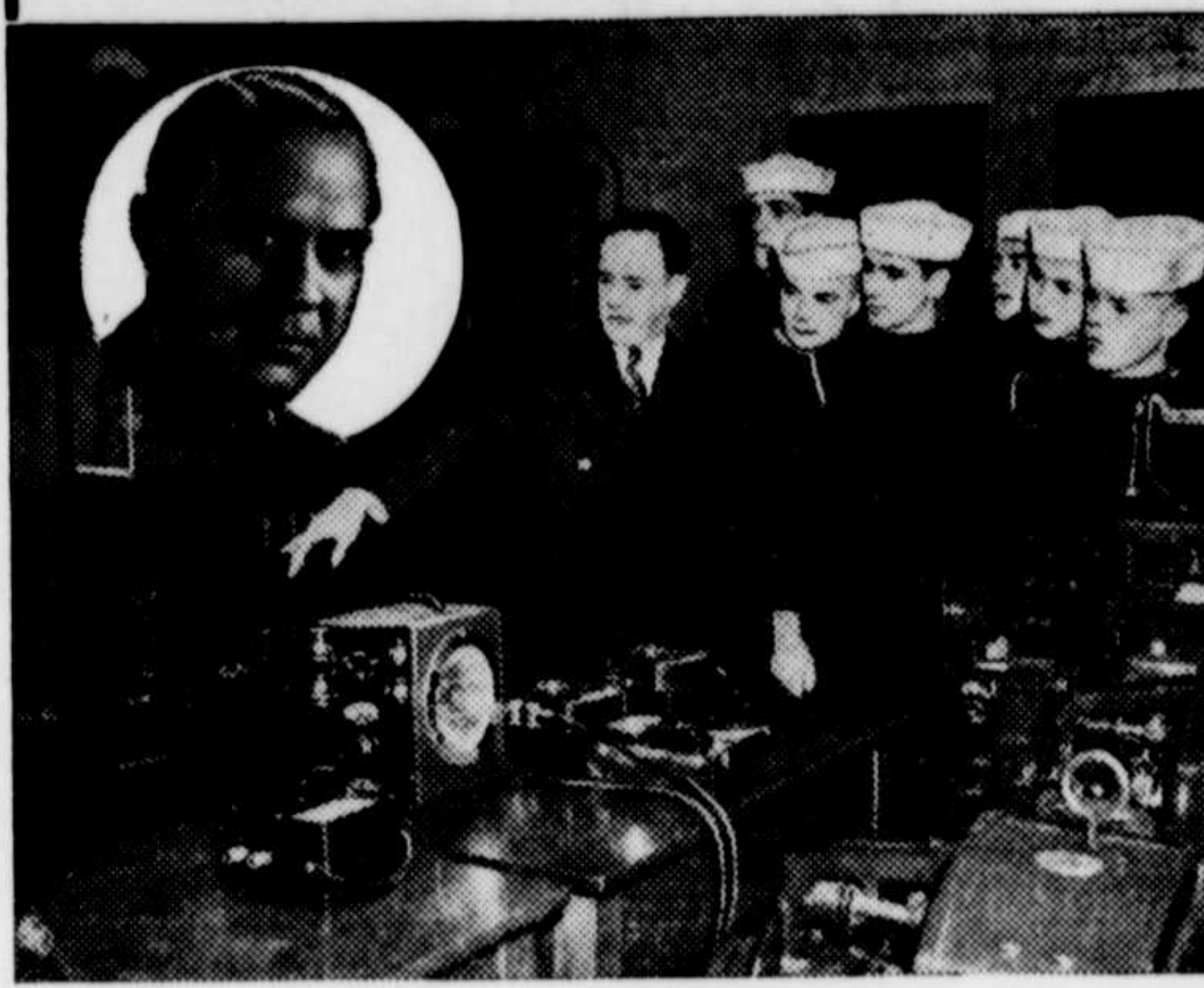

Coulter, has always been kind, affectionate and above reproach, Florence H. Coulter, on or about the first day of November, 1938, without any just cause or reason, abandoned and deserted the Plaintiff in Chester, Queen Anne's County, Md., and that such abandonment has continued uninterruptedly for at least eighteen months, to wit, from about the first day of November, 1938, to the present time, and is deliberate and final and the separation beyond any reasonable expectation or hope of reconciliation; that no children were born as a result of this marriage; that the Plaintiff is a resident of Queen Anne's County, Maryland, where he has resided all his life; that the Defendant, Florence H. Coulter, is a non-resident of the State of Maryland, and when last heard of was living in Detroit, State of Michigan; and the Plaintiff prays the Court that he be divorced A Vinculo Matrimonii from the Defendant, and that he have such other and further relief as his case may require.

It is thereupon Ordered by the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's County, in Equity, on this 17th day of September, 1941, that the Plaintiff, Harry L. Coulter, by causing a copy of this Order to be inserted in some newspaper printed and published in said Queen Anne's County, Maryland, once in each of four successive weeks before the 25th day of October, 1941, next, give notice to the said absent Defendant, Florence H. Coulter, of the object and substance of this Bill of Complaint, warning her to be and appear in this Court, in person or by Solicitor, on or before the 15th day of November, 1941, next, to show cause, if any she has, why a Decree should not be passed as prayed.

Governor's Proclamation

"Enlist For Safety Week"

October 6 to 12, 1941.

WHEREAS, traffic fatalities in the United States accounted for 34,500 accidental deaths last year, 541 of this number being Marylanders, and

WHEREAS, the whole program of Defense production is being hampered because of the increasing number of accidental deaths, and

WHEREAS, it has been shown by experience that concerted action is necessary to correct conditions causing such stupendous loss of human life, and

WHEREAS, the need for manpower is vital in order to maintain high speed production in our industries, and the shocking toll is taking from our midst men essential to the need of our Country, and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the serious traffic fatality situation now existing, President Franklin D. Roosevelt has, by Proclamation, called upon every citizen to enlist in the campaign to prevent wastage of human and material resources through accidents;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, HERBERT R. O'CONNOR, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND, do hereby proclaim the week of October 6th as "Enlist For Safety Week" in Maryland, and I call upon the people of Maryland to give their full cooperation to the Maryland Traffic Safety Commission and cooperating agencies, in their efforts for greater safety, to the end that we may have a safer Maryland and stop the totally unnecessary and unnatural death of so many of our citizens.
