Men 17 to 50 Wanted for U. S. Naval Reserve.

According to an announcement made this week in Washington by order of Secretary of the Navy Knox "All men now enlisting in the Naval Reserve will be retained on active duty throughout the period of the national emergency, but they will be released to inactive duty as soon after the emergency, as their services can be spared, regardless of the length of time remaining in their enlistment."

Enlistment in the U. S. Naval Reserve is for four years but, if a man enlists today and the emergency ends within a period of several months, he will be returned to his civilian job as soon as possible after the emergency is over, and will not be required to complete his four years term in active service.

Four classes of service in the United States Naval Reserve need men urgently today. They are Class V-3, which includes radio and communications; V-5, aviation; V-6, for trade specialists or men desiring trade or vocational training; V-7, fleet officers. A more detailed outline of each class follows below.

Men with specialized training in radio, searchlight and semaphore signaling or More telegraphy may be enrolled in Class V-3, the communications class of the Naval Reserve. These men will be enlisted as petty officers with ratings according to their degrees of proficiency. Pay for men enrolling in this group ranges from \$60 a month for a petty officer third class to \$99 a month for a chief petty officer. An additional allowance of \$1.15 per day is made for men with dependents who have the rating of petty officer second class or higher.

A man with at least two years of college education who desires to enter naval aviation will be enlisted as a seaman second class in Class V-5 of the Naval Reserve. After a month's preliminary training the V-5 recruit will become a naval aviation cadet and will be sent for advanced training to one of the three principal naval flight training centers: Pensacola, Fla.; Jacksonville, Fla.; or Corpus Christi, Texas. On completion of this advanced course which requires approximately seven months, the V-5 cadet will be designated as a naval aviator and will be commissioned as an ensign in the U. S. Naval Reserve.

During the first month of training, V-5 recruits are paid \$36. On completion of the first month's training the V-5 recruits is designated as a naval aviation cadet and will be paid \$75 a month, plus \$1 per living expense. Upon commission as an ensign his pay will be increased to approximately \$245 a month and in addition he will receive regular pay bonuses of \$500 for each year he serves in active duty after the training period.

Class V-6 in the U. S. Naval Reserve offers opportunities for men with specialized training to continue their trades and at the same time serve their country. This group includes specialists of any kind such as electricians, carpenters, machinists, stenographers, accountants, plumbers, cooks, bakers and many other trades and vocations. These men will upon enlistment be given ratings in accordance with the amount of previous specialized training they have had.

Plenty of Crabs in Somerset

Watermen of Crisfield declared yesterday the planting of sponge crabs to boost the crab population had been a huge success, with "millions" of tiny crustaceans visible in Somerset county waters.

The watermen are alive with the tiny crabs, Archie H. Smith, Smith's Island merchant, reported.

"There are millions of them there and it looks like we will have plenty of crabs for next season. The people on Smith's island believe these crabs are the result of putting overboard the female crabs in a spawn condition which were brought from Virginia several months ago."

The sponge crabs were planted in a program conducted by conservation officials, and Edgar L. Quinn Crisfield city councilman, termed the work "more successful than was anticipated."

He said the tiny crabs probably live through the winter, promising a huge crop next year. Crabbing was so poor this year that many Somerset watermen left the county to take jobs in nearby cities.

He predicted that if next year's crop is good, there will be an insistent demand that the transplanting be done on an even larger scale.

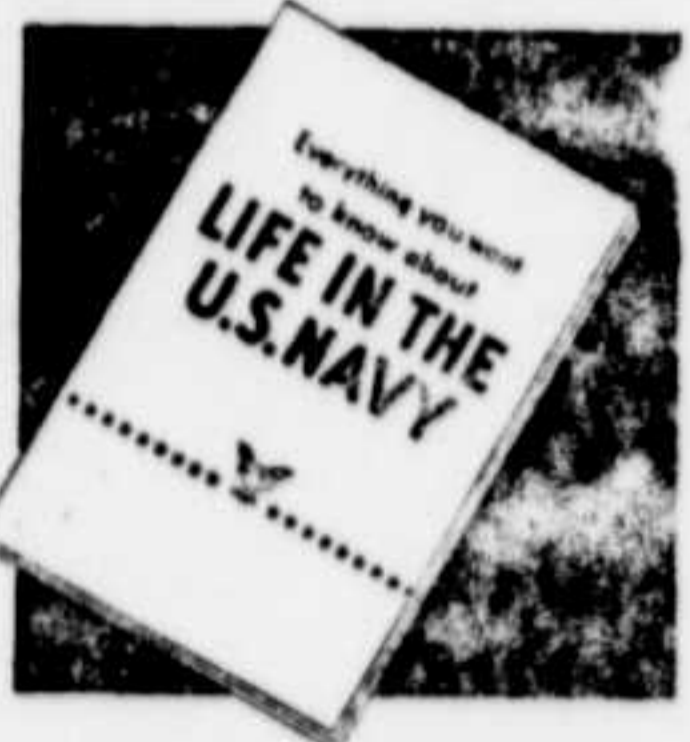
