

Cutout Non-Defense Expenditures

Calling on taxpayers in Maryland to help in the movement to reduce Federal non-defense, expenditures, Harry S. Middendorf, President of the Maryland Public Expenditure Council, Inc. issued a bulletin to taxpayer associations and leading economy workers in the State, urging them to request the Congressmen representing their districts, as well as the Maryland Senators in Washington to cooperate with Senator Harry F. Byrd of Virginia and the Joint Congressional Committee on Non Essential Expenditures, which on December 26, in a preliminary report to President Roosevelt and the Congress recommended reductions in Federal non-defense outlays totaling \$1,716,965,061.

The Committee's report is partial and preliminary, and according to Senator Byrd, after full and proper investigations have been made, it is hoped subsequent recommendations will point out additional savings which, with those recommended in this report, will possibly aggregate \$2,000,000,000.

Savings amounting to \$1,301,075 are to be effected by abolishing the CCC and the peace-time activities of the N.Y.A., skeletonizing the Works Progress Administration and sharply reducing farm subsidies and funds for public building, river and harbor and highway construction. In addition, the Committee, as a further and immediate "contribution to the financing of the war program," urged that Congress by specific legislative action "cover into" the Treasury \$415,890,061 in current non-defense appropriations which the budget bureau already has impounded.

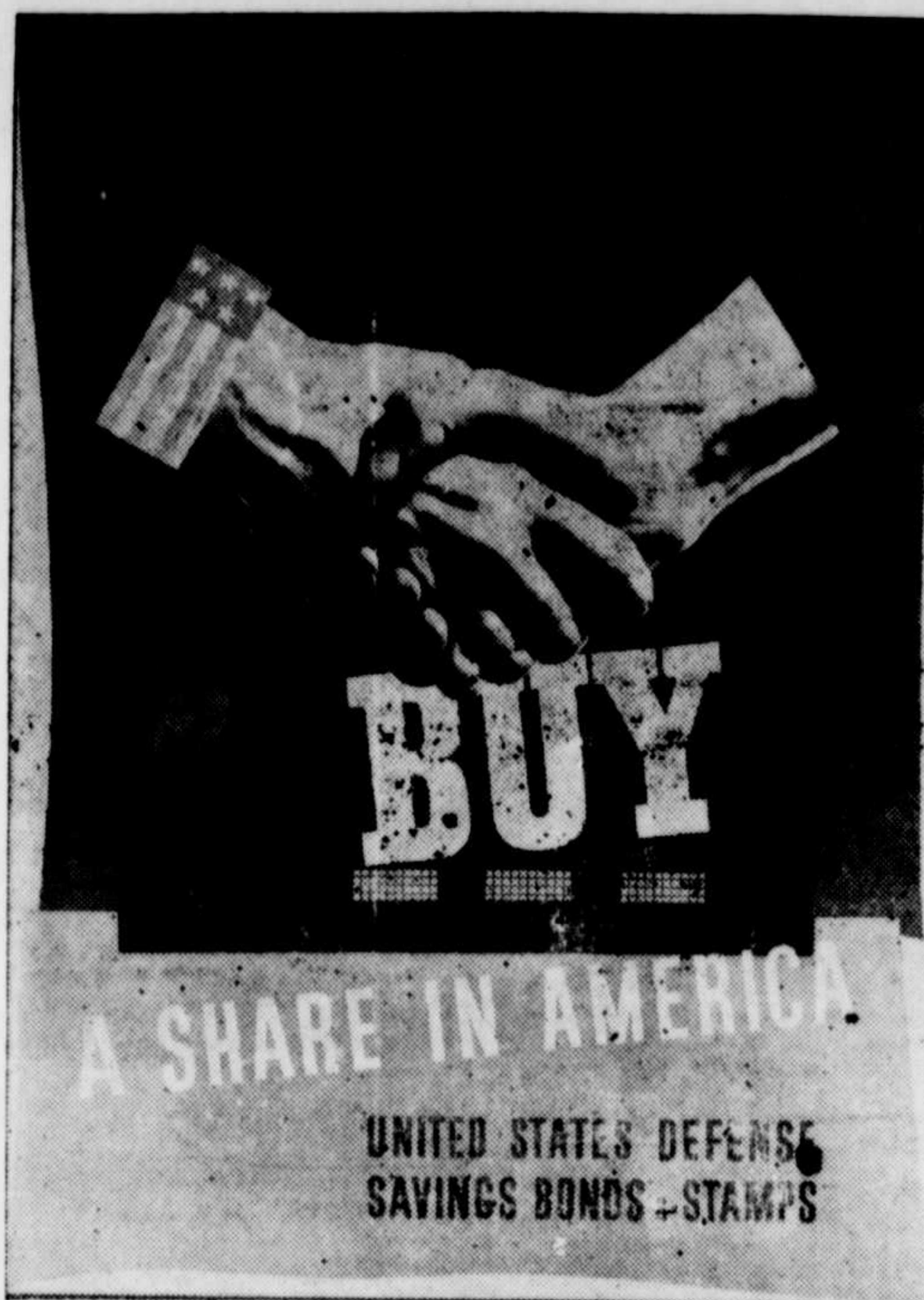
