



**Farmers Responding to Metal Saving Drive**

The County Extension Service and the County Agriculture Conservation Association, the Farm Bureau, and the Grange, have all been cooperating with OPM representative, Harry Bishop in getting farmers to gather up and dispose of their scrap iron on their farms. Mr. Bishop reports that quite a number of farmers have been bringing in varying amounts of old iron.

It seems, however, that there are still a number of individuals most of whom are not farmers who have considerable quantities of scrap iron for a higher price.

This is a very unfortunate and unpatriotic practice at this time in that it will reduce the amount of farm machinery that can be manufactured, and will also probably make it necessary for OPM to put on a much stricter regulation regarding the marketing of scrap iron. County Agent Miller states that the Extension Service will continue the campaign to get this old iron into the hands of the dealers. Farmers seem to realize that in order for them to get repairs for their farm machinery during the coming months, that this scrap iron must be gotten back to where it can be refused. They also know that prices have been established on this old iron which prices according to Mr. Bishop are 50c per hundred delivered to the yard or 40c to 45c on the farm depending upon the quantity and quality the individual offers for sale.

**Farmers Repairing Machinery**

County Agent Miller reports that the farm machinery repair phase of the National Defense Program is progressing satisfactorily. A recent survey was started and the results so far indicate that many farmers are checking over their machinery and getting repairs, also having considerable repair work done.

Mr. Miller points out that it is extremely important that all farmers immediately take some steps to see that their machinery is in first class shape, before production season starts. Everyone knows that labor of all kinds will be very scarce and the ability to get the most work done in the shortest amount of help will depend very largely upon the forethought and preparation made at this time.

Farmers must not neglect this important matter, says Mr. Miller simply because some priorities have been granted on farm machinery and repairs. The slogan that "Food Will Win The War And Write Peace" places a very definite challenge before the farmers of the United States.
