

Turkey Crop Increase Seen

Maryland turkey growers are ready to comply with the Department of Agriculture's request for a ten percent increase in production.

W.H. Rice, poultry specialist for the University of Maryland Extension Service, said a survey that included eighty-nine farms having 7,493 breeding birds definitely indicated the readiness of Maryland grower to meet production goals.

Rice said that twenty-nine of these farms which were also inspected in 1941 have an increase of about twelve per cent over last year.

That figure may be high for the whole State, Rice said, because these are principally commercial turkey farms. He added, however, that small flocks are also larger and said it appeared that growers' intentions are to produce 8 to 10 per cent more turkeys in Maryland this year than they did in 1941.

The survey showed a trend toward use of better meat type breeding stock, with several breeders having flocks of pure meat or so-called "broad-breasted" strains recently obtained from local and western breeders.

Rice said the fact that only four of the 89 flocks were in poor condition due to disease and parasites indicated better feeding and sanitation practices compared with last year.

Hybrid Corn Test Planned

The Agronomy Department of the University of Maryland in cooperation with the Experiment Station and Extension Service are now planning farm demonstrations of Hybrid Corn which will be held during the coming summer.

Hybrids that have been most promising in tests during the past few years will be tested under farm conditions to further determine their value in the different sections of the state. This information is of great importance to farmers in Maryland as the acreage of Hybrid corn has increased rapidly in recent years and farmers need to know what Hybrid will grow best in their particular section of the state.

Generally speaking, a Hybrid will do equally well under similar soil and other conditions. Some have been developed for soils of high moisture content and others that do well under drought conditions. The type and fertility of the soil is another important consideration in selecting the proper hybrid to plant.

County agents will supervise the plantings and follow the tests thru harvest. Under the plan that has been worked out, meetings will be held in the various sections of the state and results of the tests discussed with farmers. The county agricultural agents are now furnishing to farmers information in regard to the project.
