

### Shoe Canners are Held to Ceiling Prices

Canners of tomatoes in the State are warned not to sell at over ceiling prices.

During the 25-day price holiday, Maryland CFA Director Leo H. McCann said, "processors were to get the full price for their tomatoes. Now they must return to price ceilings."

"The State involved reports that some processors are selling their tomatoes at prices which are far over the legal ceilings. These illegal sales must be stopped as immediate steps will be taken to enforce the maximum prices," Lewis B. Laporte, chief of the food price division at the State CFA office, said prices for tomatoes were reported to be ranging as high as \$2 to \$2.50 per case of 24 lbs. 2 cases.

These Eastern State processors whose 1947 ceiling price has been established at \$1.50 at the maximum price, he said, and those who have not yet filed for 1948 ceiling must either seek the new ceiling to be set at \$1.50 or the ceiling price for the 1947 year, which ranged from 50 cents to \$1.50.

The ceiling price for each year's pack, he continued, have shown slight increases to reflect rising production costs. However, he said, ceiling prices already established for this season's pack would range only slightly higher than last year, and prices of \$2 to \$2.50 were being reported are above the maximum legal price.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's County, IN EQUITY, and by the authority thereof, on this 26th day of August, 1948, that the Plaintiff, Louise E. Greene, by reading a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper printed and published in Queen Anne's County, Maryland once in each of four consecutive weeks before the 26th day of September 1948, cause to be published in the said court Defendant, Henry T. Greene, of the object and substance of the Bill of Complaint, warning him to be and appear in this Court in person or by attorney, before the 26th day of September, 1948, next, to show cause, if any he has, why a decree should not be as prayed.
