Pleads for Neutral Press

The report declared that if the press would strive to remain neutral in discussing foreign events there would be less chance of arousing militant public opinion in this country in favor of one or the other embattled factions.

Discussing the danger of propaganda from abroad, the report said:

"Foreign papers printed abroad, like the Moscow News, are striving to gain a circulation in our country. The short-wave radio carries foreign propaganda to thousands of our peo-

Referring to the tendency of "certain groups of our citizens to interfere in the domestic affairs of foreign nations, the committee remarked that "sometimes this has resulted in criticism by our public officials who should know better."

Mahoney on Committee

The report was signed by Louis L. Babcock, chairman, and William J. Donovan, H. Bartow Farr, Horace C. Hale, Stewart F. Hancock, Deering Howe, Francis K. Kernan, Jeremiah T. Mahoney, T. Carl Nixon, John P. O'Brien and John F. O'Ryan.

A footnote at the end of the report says that Mr. Mahoney subscribes to all sections of the report save the one referring to the Moscow News and the tendency of some groups of citizens to interfere in the domestic affairs of other nations.

New Type of Service

In an address before the association, which is holding its meeting at the Bar Association headquarters, 42 West Fourty-fourth Street, New York City, Cornelius W. Wickersham declared that the volume of rules, regulations and press releases emanating from Government bureaus requires a new type of service from lawyers. Law schools should prepare them for this new type of work, he said.

"Due to the enormous increase in the rules, regulations and press releases of administrative bureaus and commissions, education and training are required in the whole subject of delegated powers and their consequences," Mr. Wickersham said. "There is scarcely any business activity which is not affected by these rules. What was law yesterday is no longer law today, and may again be changed tomorrow. Familiarity with the processes as well as with the details is essential to the practicing lawyer who may be called up to advise business or businessmen.

"This is a subject that requires the attention of law schools and bar examiners, to the end that in the future the members of the Bar may be better able to advise their clients in the hurly-burly of the press releases of bureaucracy.

"It is not sufficient to say that these processés are contrary to our established habits of mind. We must show curselves of sufficiently elastic mental ability to meet the practical demands of the new order," Mr. Wickersham declared.
