

New Telephone Rates

The new rate in Kent County as proposed for the Chestertown, Galena, UE Rock Hall and Still Pond exchanges

are as follows: Individual line per month for business phone \$3.50, an increase of 50 cents per month over present rate; for residence \$2.75, an increase of 75 cents per month. Four party lines, per month \$3.00, increase of 50 cents per month over present rates; for residence \$2.00 per month, an increase of 50 cents. Rural line, per month \$3, an increase of 50 cents per month; for residence \$2.00, an increase of 50 cts. Extension Station line per month \$1, an increase of 50 cents; residence 50 cents, same as before. Service line stations \$1.00 per month, an increase of \$7 per year; residence 66 2-3 cents, an increase of \$3 per year.




