(continued from page 1) As to the money which will be required by such legislation and the methods of raising that money, the Governor declined to express an opinion.

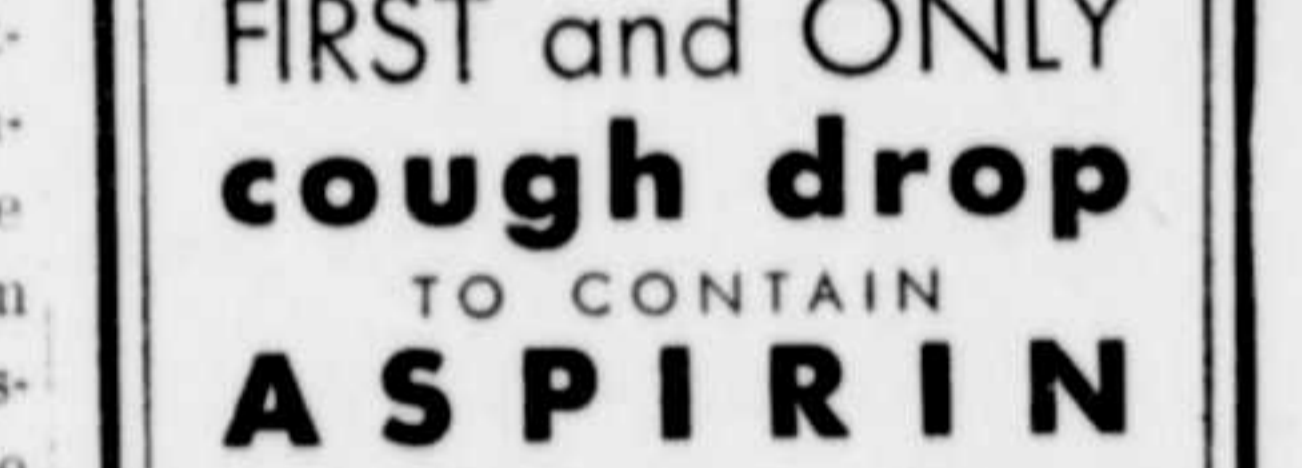
RETRIEVER TRIALS POSTPONED
